Big Sir Message: Thanks to Dr. Isaac Brundage for an inside view as to what he does and how what his department does to increase the student enrollment at Chico State. He let us know all that he oversees, and it's not surprising that he needs a staff of nearly 300 people to take care of his responsibilities. He informed us on just a small part of what is necessary to make 13,000 plus students succeed in their studies to want to come back to Chico State in the future to secure their degree. The slides he showed magnified just how much the people of the City of Chico depend on the students and how important their dollars are to the life blood of this town. As he said, his responsibility is to increase the number of students enrolled at Chico State and it was apparent that

his target market is from Butte County and the surrounding counties. His slide showed that over a quarter of our students are coming from Butte County and that the highest percentage of them are Hispanic. He confirmed a question I asked him, that when I graduated from CSUC, and up until the 80's, 75% of the students were Caucasian from all over the State and less than 25% of the students got any kind of grants or student loans of any kind and today it is exactly the opposite. Seventy-five percent of the student population is nonwhite and 75% get some type of student assistance and most of them are from the surrounding counties. I am an avid sports fan and when I asked if

<u>COMMENTS</u>: This hike is generally on a paved path with some elevation changes. The trail is being resurfaced so be aware of work in the area. We need to be aware of other trail users that may include joggers and cyclists. Hikers who opt to walk less than the 5.5 mile loop will find it easy to return to the cars before the far point of the hike is reached. 
