COMMENTS: We will be walking over uneven terrain. We may negotiate steep sections of trail as well as rocky terrain. There are numerous trip hazards.



Music Notes Mbube/Wimoweh/The Lion Sleeps Tonight

The happy word "wimoweh" has been universally recognized for the song known as "The Lion Sleeps Tonight." From Pete Seeger's version in 1952 (titled "Wimoweh") to the Tokens' No. 1 single in 1961 (The Lion Sleeps Tonight) to its featured role in the hugely popular Disney film and Broadway musical *The Lion King*, the song has enchanted generations, sold millions of copies and passed into the world's musical language as a modern folk tune.

However, "The Lion Sleeps Tonight" has an interesting history with convoluted copyright issues. Solomon Linda was born in the Zulu heartland of South Africa in 1909. He never learned to read or write, but he had a knack for songwriting. In his mid-20s, he moved to Johannesburg, where he led an a capella band that charmed audiences in the local beer halls. He sang in a high soprano over four-part harmony chants, a style that would come to define a whole generation of Zulu music. This sound was the basis for many of Linda's songs, including his most famous, "Mbube."

In Zulu, "Mbube" (EEM-boo-beh) means "lion." During his childhood, Linda had worked as a herder protecting cattle in the African hinterlands. The main predator was the lion. The spartan lyrics of his song center on the phrase "mbube zimbe," or "lion stop." When Linda and his group, the Original Evening Birds, cut a 78-rpm recording of the song in 1939, it became the first African record to sell over 100,000 copies.

In the '40s, the song's popularity spread through Europe. Though record companies in the U.S. weren't interested, noted folk music historian Alan Lomax was. In 1949, Alan Lomax, then working as folk music director for Decca Records, brought Solomon Linda's recording to the attention of his friend Pete Seeger, leader of the folk group **The Weavers.** Delighted by the joyous call of what he heard as "Wimoweh," Seeger worked up a version with his band the Weavers.

In November 1951, after having performed the song in their concerts, The Weavers recorded an adapted single titled "Wimoweh", a mishearing of the original song's chorus of "Mbube" (EEM-boo-beh). There was no writing credit mention of Solomon Linda.

The song became a popular staple for nightclub acts. The Weavers' live version gave it another boost in 1957. "Wimoweh" was recorded by others a few times, but only achieved significant financial success in 1961, when George Weiss rearranged it with a new set of words and gave it to doo-wop group **The Tokens**, calling it "The Lion Sleeps Tonight".

Additional publicity came from *The Lion King* which was a 1994 American animated <u>musical</u> produced by <u>Walt Disney Feature Animation</u> and released under <u>Walt Disney</u> <u>Pictures</u>. The use of the song "<u>The Lion Sleeps Tonight</u>" in a scene led to even more awareness for the song but disputes between Disney and the family of South African <u>Solomon Linda</u>, who had composed the song originally titled "Mbube" in 1939.


In July 2004, Linda's family filed a lawsuit, seeking \$1.6 million in royalties from Disney. In February 2006, Linda's heirs reached a settlement with Abilene Music, who held the worldwide rights and had licensed the song to Disney for an undisclosed amount of money.
